John G. Browning was a trial and appellate litigator in Texas and Oklahoma for more than 37 years, and served as a justice on Texas' Fifth District Court of Appeals in Dallas. He now teaches law full time at Faulkner University's Thomas Goode Jones School of Law in Montgomery, Alabama. Justice Browning is a national thought leader at the intersection of law and technology, and is the author of five law books and more than 75 law review articles, as well as hundreds of other articles in bar journals and national legal publications. He served as the inaugural Chair of the State Bar of Texas' AI Task Force, and was also appointed by the Supreme Court of Alabama's Commission on Artificial Intelligence. A past chair of the Institute for Law and Technology at Center for American and International Law, Justice Browning was named to the Fastcase 50 list of top lawyers and tech visionaries in 2018. He is an honors graduate of Rutgers University and the University of Texas School of Law.
