### **Major Emma K. Fowler**

Major Emma Fowler graduated magna cum laude with highest departmental honors in 2008 from the University of California, Los Angeles with a Bachelor of Arts in History. She received her Juris Doctorate from the University of California, Los Angeles School of Law in 2013. In 2023, she received her LL.M. in Military Law as a Distinguished Graduate from The Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School. In 2024, she graduated from the Command and General Staff Officer Course at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, with a Masters in Operational Studies (MOS) as a Distinguished Graduate.

MAJ Fowler entered the Army Judge Advocate General's Corps (JAG Corps) in 2014. Her first assignment was as a legal assistance attorney at Fort Sill, Oklahoma. At Fort Sill, she also served as a trial counsel for the 31st Air Defense Artillery Brigade and as an administrative law attorney for the Fires Center of Excellence. Her next assignment was at Tower Barracks, Grafenwoehr, Germany, where she served as a defense counsel. She was then selected to be the senior trial counsel for Seventh Army Training Command at Tower Barracks. MAJ Fowler then served as the Editor-in-Chief of The Army Lawyer at The Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School where she also taught Graduate Course, Officer Basic Course, and Warrant Officer students about grammar, editing, and The Bluebook. After earning her LL.M. and MOS, she was assigned to her current position as the Senior Defense Counsel in the Fort Bragg Field Office of the U.S. Army Trial Defense Service.
